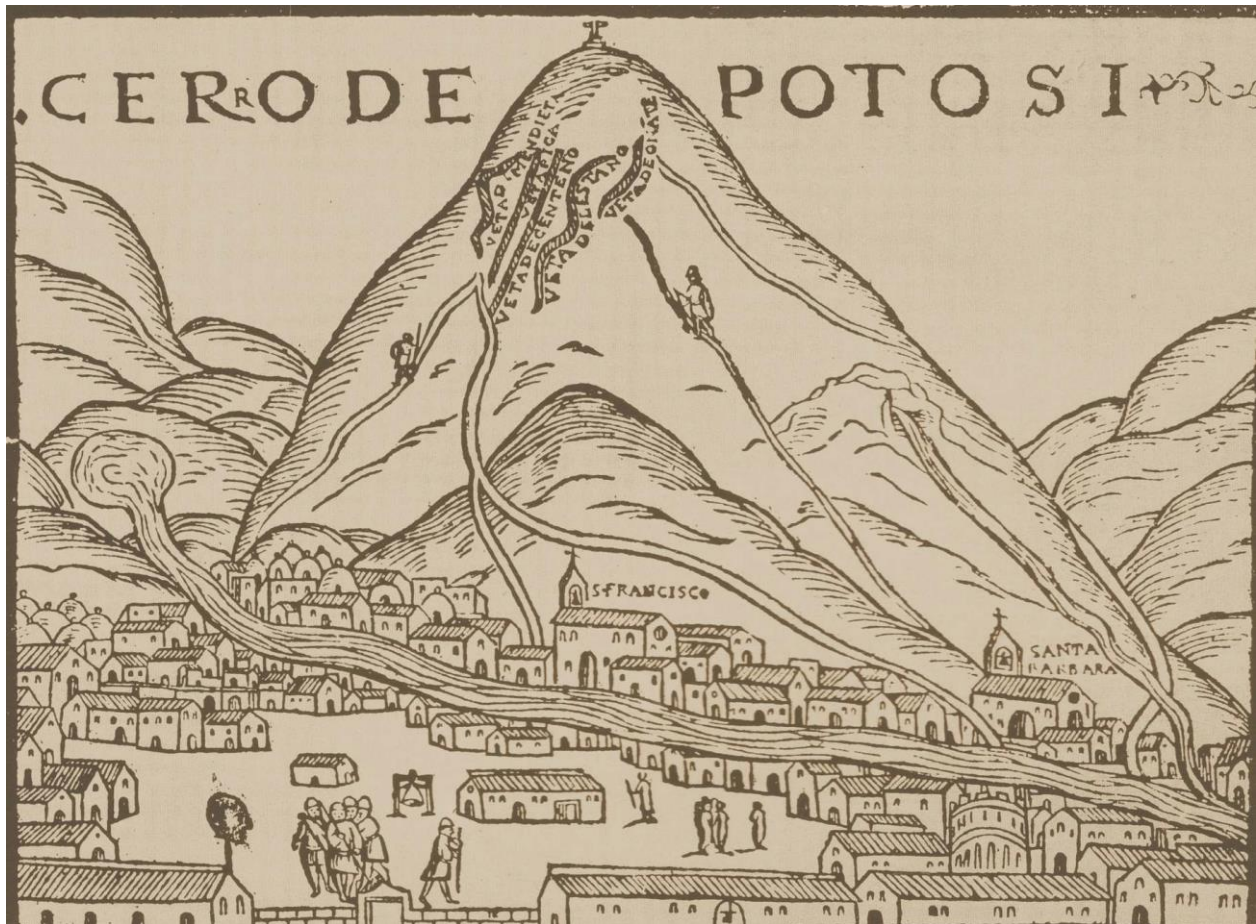
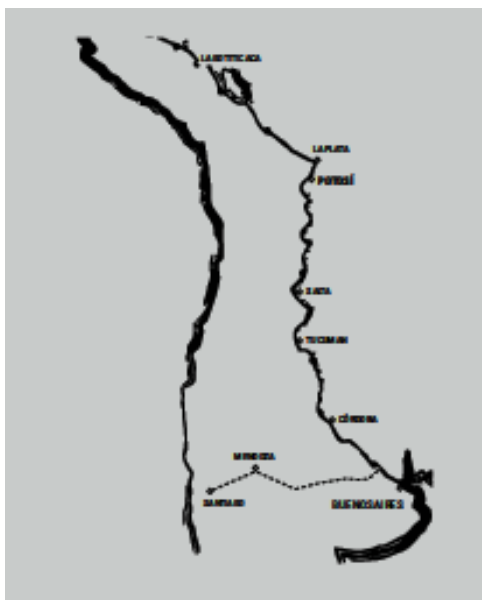


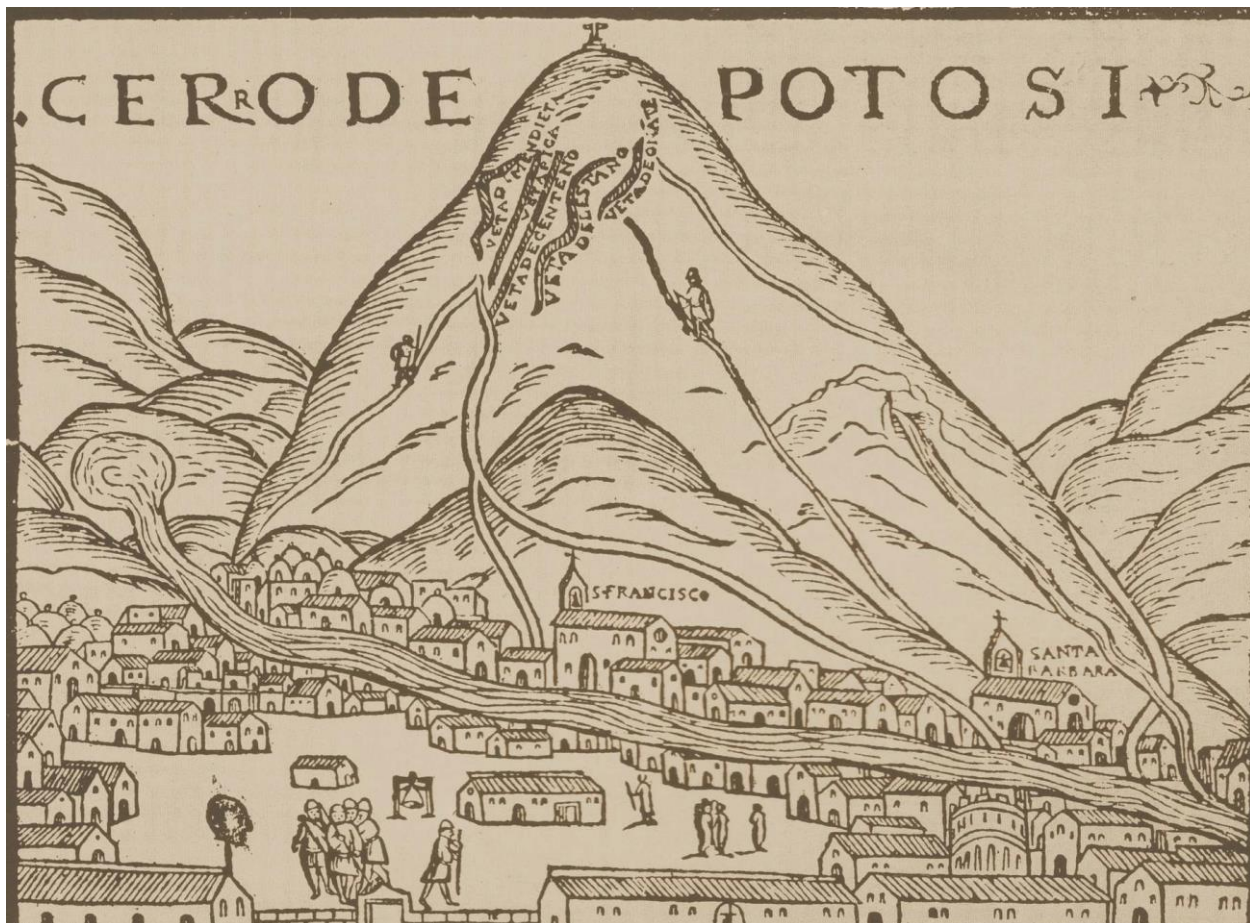


First known engraving of the Cerro Rico of Potosí, in Bolivia, made by the chronicler and conqueror Pedro Cieza de León in 1549.

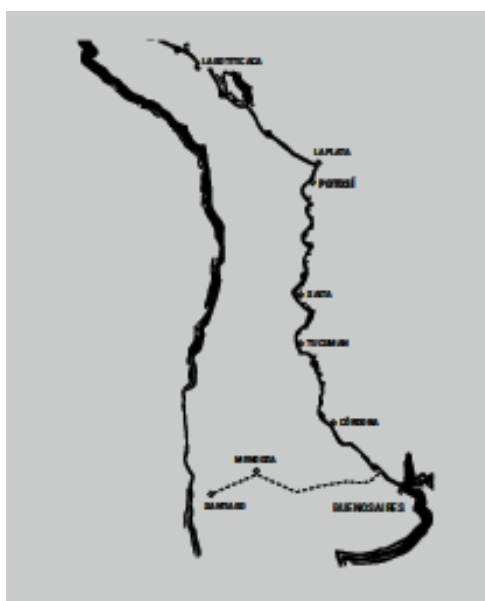


This huge mountain full of silver, began to be drilled by around 120 mines generating a large Spanish, native and slave settlement as well as a great diversity of trades that were required for the minting of coins: testers, scale operators, smelters, transporters and muleteers, among others.
